## ANNUAL EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE ELECTIONS 2020 CALL FOR NOMINATIONS

#### Article X – Nomination and Election Procedures

#### 1. Nomination of Candidates:

- a. The Club President will appoint a Nominating Committee in preparation for the coming election. The Nominating Committee will be comprised of three members. Chaired by a member of the existing Executive Committee, and including at least one Club member who is not currently on the Executive Committee.
- b. The purpose of the Nominating Committee is to prepare a list of eligible Active Regular members as nominees for the offices of President, Vice President, Secretary, Treasurer, Indoor Range Officer, Outdoor Range Officer, Junior Shooting Program Director, and three (3) Club Directors. These ten officers and directors comprise the Executive Committee of the Club.
- c. The December issue of the *Crack Shot* will include a Nominations form for the purpose of petitioning members to submit names of potential candidates for office. To be considered, the Nominations form must be returned to the Club Secretary prior to the January Regular Club Meeting.
- d. The Nominating Committee will review the submitted names and contact other members to solicit names of members interested in becoming a Candidate for office. The names of all members who have expressed interest in proceeding to an election will be presented at the Regular Club Meeting in January. At the January meeting, any additional names submitted will be included in the listing.
- e. Immediately following the January Regular meeting, a Mail-In Ballot will be prepared and will be included in the February issue of the *Crack Shot*. This Ballot will list each Club Officer position and the name of members who are candidates for each office.



### Shotgun Shooters:

Do not shoot the wooden or metal target stands on purpose. Shooting at target stands deliberately, is vandalism.

#### Pistol Shooters:

  prevent ricochets. Pipes were removed from the ground and we will now use the above
  ground Target stands. This should make it safer to shoot and enjoy.

### A Short History of Freedom

Why does anyone among the common man have personal freedom? This is far more than simply an academic question.

As we look back into the faint recordings of history, imperfect as those are, we see mirrored practically every good and bad aspect of civilization. We see war, famine, oppression, strife, and grief. We see artistic, engineering, literary, and scientific marvels. We see advances and setbacks in all areas of human endeavor. Throughout history and among hundreds of civilizations spanning thousands of years, from the earliest recordings, until the present, we see the continuing inevitable overall advancement of knowledge.

However, we do note the conspicuous absence of one thing. From the earliest recordings until the 1700s, what we do not see is the existence of <u>personal</u> freedom for the common folk.

Throughout those thousands of years of recorded history and across the world: individual freedom, as a feature of everyday human existence for the common man living within any advanced society, simply did not exist. Even in the most "democratic" of those societies, only the powerful (rich) had the freedom to routinely do as they pleased. Consider, for example, the history of slavery, which was worldwide throughout most of history and is still a very common evil, practiced widely, in one form or another, over most of the Earth.

Some seem to argue that Personal Freedom is overrated. I will not debate that elitist philosophy. (Technically, that point is moot to this discussion.) For the purposes of this treatise, I will hold that no human being could possibly find anything more precious than Personal Freedom. Those who do not agree with that philosophy have ulterior motives, are dangerously ignorant of reality, or are simply insane.

The critical question is: Exactly what seminal event changed the course of history and thereby the lot of the common man, so that, about 400 years ago, we began to see individuals who were able to claim and to enforce their God-given right to personal freedom? The answer would astound most folks and even most historical scholars. But, if they will only study history, they will learn this cold, hard fact: The magic potion that engendered Freedom for the masses was made of cold, hard steel.

In the 1700s, for the first time in civilized history, the average individual had a means of defeating a well-trained, armored warrior and therefore, a means of defeating the hired and trained mercenaries of the wealthy few. How so, you might ask. The answer: *The Affordable Gun.* In that era, the advent of efficient steam engines provided the first effective means of ridding mines of water. That detail was crucial to the inchoate industrial revolution. With the advent of that revolution, the cost of guns and ammunition components began to plummet.

As a result, for the first time <u>ever</u>, the average person could afford to own and use a weapon that was routinely capable of defeating armor. Of course, then as now, the ruling elite fought aggressively to prevent the average <u>subject</u> from owning such a weapon. In that era, the reasons behind that legalistic oppression were perhaps more obvious to the average person than those reasons are today; nevertheless, those reasons were, are, and always will be identical — elitist suppression of the personal freedom for the masses. It is a fact that without the affordable gun, freedom for the masses would never have happened. It is equally a fact that as soon as the masses lose that means of preserving their God-given rights, freedom will inevitably perish, as has repeatedly been proven throughout this modern world's brief history.

Consider that since about 1890 various governments have disarmed their citizens and, within a few short years, proceeded to murder them. Governments have used this precise method to facilitate genocides that have taken the lives of more than one-hundred-twenty million innocent citizens. Those genocides are a fact of history that the hysterical rhetoric of politicians cannot change. And, never forget that political rhetoric brought on every one of the disarmaments that ultimately resulted in those genocides!

Whatever he or she might claim, every politician who preaches gun control is actually attempting to prepare their country for inevitable tyranny, and the inevitable consequences of tyranny are all too well proven — it has never failed to <u>eventually</u> bring genocide. Those who gnash their teeth, bewailing the supposed carnage brought about by the "evil" gun continuously ignore the vastly more damaging facets of human nature that are necessarily rampant in any *free* society. But, I shall not argue that point, as I find it an exercise in banality.

The point I will argue is the undeniable fact that we have a choice: We can choose to live in *freedom* and accept that such *liberty* necessarily must include a certain admixture of evil and bad; else, we can choose to live in a Police State, for, as the subjects of Great Britain and all too many other countries are now in the process of learning the hard way, no enduring intermediate condition can ever exist. In this regard, I find the following observation to be obvious: A price exists for freedom; any society is either willing to pay that price or is

destined to suffer under the inevitable consequences of the alternative — a Police State, or worse.

As for me and mine, we will choose Freedom. Those who do not are my mortal enemies. Because, either through deliberate action or through apathy, they would be the death of me and mine. Their deliberate ignorance of that fact leaves the fault entirely and eternally on their heads, may God have mercy on them.

### SO WHAT'S THE 3 GUN SHOOT ALL ABOUT?

If you are feeling like Rambo, Dirty Harry or John Wayne, you may want to participate in the super-fun 3 Gun Shoots. They can add another dimension and challenge to your shooting skills not to mention, give you an adrenaline rush while sharing in the excitement of friendly competition (actually competition with yourself). <u>All with safety as a priority</u>.

The course changes every month; the <u>November 9<sup>th</sup></u> course consisted of 24 pistol targets, 13 shotgun (including 1 slug) targets and 26 rifle targets. It started out seated in a vehicle; at the buzzer, the shooter had to shoot 6 pistol shots at two turning targets for accuracy points (targets turned away at 8 seconds!).

After the shooter secured their pistol, they retrieved their rifle from the passenger side of the vehicle, and upon exiting the vehicle proceeded through 5 rifle stations: knockdowns, plates, frangible and accuracy targets.

At the last rifle station, the rifle was "made safe," then the shooter transitioned through 3 pistol targets and retrieved their shotgun. Over a 40-yard zig-zag course, there were 12 knockdown and one slug target. The shotgun was then "made safe" and the shooter transitioned to pistol. The pistol stage was a 30-yard loop with knockdown and accuracy targets.

Each participant goes through the course twice at whatever pace they feel most comfortable with. Scoring is an aggregate of both rounds consisting of time minus accuracy plus penalty points.

**The NRA Pledge:** I certify that I am a citizen of the United States of America and that I am not a member of any organization or group which has in any part of its programs-the attempt to overthrow the Government of the USA or any of its political subdivisions by force or violence; that I have never been convicted of a crime of violence, and if admitted to membership, I will faithfully endeavor to fulfill the obligations of good sportsmanship and good citizenship.

**Four Corners Rifle & Pistol Club Pledge:** I further declare that I support the Constitution of the USA and swear not to support any movement that would close shooting facilities, deny access to public lands, restrict hunting sports, or in any way limit the rights of honest citizens to own firearms in a legal manner.

**NRA Membership Required**: For insurance purposes you **MUST** be a <u>MEMBER of the NRA</u> in order to be a member of Four Corners Rifle and Pistol Club. Your NRA Membership number is required on the next page of this Application.

### **Range Safety Rules**

- Treat every firearm as if it were loaded.
- Never point a firearm at anything you do not intend to destroy.
- Keep your finger straight and off the trigger until you are ready to fire.
- Keep the firearm on safe until you intend to fire.
- All Federal State, and Local firearm laws must be obeyed.

### Safety is of paramount importance to everyone on the range & it is our top priority

- 1. All personnel utilizing the range complex for recreational firing will adhere to the safe storage, handling, and use of firearms and ammunition. All firearms not on the firing line will be unloaded and racked with actions opened and magazines removed.
- 2. All junior members and shooters under eighteen years of age will shoot/fire under the supervision of a qualified adult.
- 3. Fully automatic firearms, and Tracer and/or AP ammunition is prohibited unless a training event or demonstration is scheduled with the Outdoor Range Officer prior to the event.
- 4. <u>Firearms will be un-cased and cased at the firing line only</u> with the actions open/safe, muzzle pointed down range and in a safe direction at all times. Firearms that are carried to the range UN-cased will have their actions opened and/or flagged, unloaded magazines, and with the firearm's safety placed on safe.
- 5. IF A "CEASE FIRE" IS CALLED FOR <u>ANY</u> REASON Stop Shooting IMMEDIATELY and remove your finger from the trigger. Depending on the reason for the cease fire, all firearms shall then be unloaded, magazines removed, actions open, and/or chamber flags placed into the open action and pointed in a safe direction down range if it is not feasible to physically rack the firearm.
- 6. Shooters are not permitted forward of the red line or to handle their firearms, scopes, or anything on the bench while a cease-fire is in force and people are downrange.
- 7. Any person not complying with the above safety rules or who becomes disruptive will be removed from the range and will be banned from the use of the range until the matter is brought before the Club Executive Committee for adjudication.
- 8. Members are totally responsible for the conduct and actions of their guests. Members will ensure that their guests comply with these and all other Club rules while at the range and will never leave guests unattended at the range.
- 9. **ABOVE ALL, PLEASE BE COURTEOUS.** WE ARE ALL RESPONSIBLE FOR EACH OTHER'S SAFETY. ALL FIREARMS MUST BE MADE SAFE PRIOR TO GOING DOWN RANGE BY OPENING AND/OR FLAGGING ACTIONS, REMOVING THE BOLT, OR RACKING THE FIREARM IF FEASIBLE. <u>REMEMBER</u>: EVERYONE AROUND YOU HAS A LOADED FIREARM. USE COMMON SENSE AND ESPECIALLY COMMON COURTESY AT ALL TIMES.
