

HOW ABOUT REASONABLE GUN CONTROL?

In the August, 2020 American Rifleman Magazine, Jason Ouimet, Executive Director, NRA, Institute for Legislative Action (ILA) authored an article about candidates' opinions on the 2nd Amendment.

Mr. Ouimet mentioned that there are "radical and extreme gun controls" that are simply unreasonable. Everything from more registration, e.g. gun owner licensing to a total confiscation of semi-automatic rifles. At the very least, various political candidates endorse these reasons citing law abiding American citizens are not to be trusted nor are they competent enough to own hand guns or military type rifles.

We, who are members of the 4CRP, obey the laws of the land. We believe in controlling our firearms in a safe manner and respecting our gun club and range rules. We tirelessly train members and non-members, especially our youth, on how to be safe and to respect others' 2nd Amendment Rights.

I endorse "reasonable" gun control. We, gun owners, need to be proactive and guard against being complacent about our own responsibility to safeguard our freedom for future generations.

REMINDERS:

- ✓ **MEMBERS MUST BE PRESENT IF THEIR KEY IS USED AT THE OUTDOOR RANGE**. Please be prepared to show your 4CRP Membership Card whenever asked!
- ✓ Keep the gate closed and lock it when you leave
- ✓ There are extra trash bags in the Target Shed; if the trash is full, please take it to the dumpster. Little things like this will help to keep the Outdoor Range tidy and clean so all of us can enjoy it.
- ✓ Shooters in the field need to be aware of their target and what is behind that target, i.e., can the bullet potentially ricochet into one of the other ranges or over the berm? You are responsible for the bullet once it leaves the muzzle of your qun.
- ✓ Please be aware of cylinder and muzzle blasts on the sandbags which can cause holes to be burnt in the denim covering.

Fall Pistol League

Attention: All You Pistol Shooters!

Plans for the **Four Corners Rifle & Pistol Club's** Fall Bulls Eye Pistol League have been announced. The basic league format will be essentially the same as last year. We will be shooting to establish your group placement on <u>Wednesday</u>, <u>November 11th from 3:00 to 7:00 PM</u> at the **Indoor Range**. Shooters may also use last year's ending league score average--shooter's choice. League shooting will begin on **November 18th** and continue for 8 weeks until **January 6, 2021**.

Shooters will be divided into Red Dot and Iron Sight categories, and we also will have an Off-The-Chart category for new shooters, your choice.

Each night everyone will shoot 30 rounds of centerfire and 30 rounds of .22 rimfire on 3 targets in each category at a distance of 50 feet.

Eye & ear protection is required for all shooters. Weekly practice will be on Saturdays from 9:00 to 1 p.m.

Shooter fees will be \$20.00 for Club members and \$30.00 for non-members payable at qualifying or first league night. There will also be a \$2.00 fee for targets at the practice sessions. The range will be open for practice on Wednesday, November 4th and Saturday, November 7th.
