- You can start applying for a new or renewal membership on December 1, 2020.
- Memberships run from March 1, 2021 to February 28, 2022. New keys to the Outdoor Range are available on March 1st
- Effective December 1st, dues are \$55 annually for a regular member. Check application in this issue for other options/details.
- Active *NRA Membership is required for all levels of membership in 4CRP; NRA membership number and expiration date
 are required on the 4CRP application.
- Every applicant is required to complete the revised membership application, read and agree that you will comply with the Outdoor Range Use and Safety Rules by signing the application certification.
- All applications for membership must contain **REQUIRED** and/or **MANDATORY** information to be processed. This includes:
 - Current mailing address (so your membership card can be mailed to you and/or you wish to receive newsletters via U.S. mail)
 - Telephone number (a must to verify your application info if needed, e.g. you are who you say you are, etc., or contact you in an emergency situation).
 - Email address: 4CRP primarily communicates with its members regularly via emails to let members know about Club activities, events, range closures, request for volunteers, send newsletters, etc. Email addresses are kept CONFIDENTIAL (unless a member has given the Club authorization to publish it)

Thoughts from Mike Upchurch, 4CRP Vice President

Shooting Fundamentals Matter!

Every sport has its own set of fundamentals; shooting is no different. When shooting, following basic rules can improve your shooting accuracy, whether you are a competitive shooter, hunter, or just target practice.

The NRA has endorsed the following fundamentals:

- 1. In aiming or sight alignment, line up, or align your dominant eye, the rear sight, the front sight and the target.
- 2. In <u>breath</u> control, as you are pointing the front sight at the aiming bullseye, exhale and stop breathing. Do not breathe until after the shot is fired. You should not stop breathing longer than 8 to 10 seconds.
- 3. In the <u>hold</u> control, think and concentrate on holding your body as still as you can.
- 4. In <u>trigger</u> control there are two rules for good trigger control: (1) Pull the trigger while you are holding steady and (2) Pull the trigger smoothly, without disturbing your hold.
- 5. <u>Follow-through</u>: Never anticipate the shot or move before you squeeze the trigger. *Follow-through is a fundamental element in all sports*.

So remember what your sight picture looked like when the shot was fired. Was it good or were your sights pointed to one side or high or low? Was it a safe shot?

Indoor Range Notes

Fall Pistol League

There is still time to get into the Fall Pistol League at the Indoor Range. Remaining dates are: Wednesdays, 3-7 p.m., <u>December 2, 9, 16, 23, 30, and January 6th</u>. The basic league format is essentially the same as last year. Shooters are divided into <u>Red Dot</u> and <u>Iron Sight</u> categories, and we also will have an Off-The-Chart category for new shooters, your choice. Each night everyone will shoot 30 rounds of centerfire and 30 rounds of .22 rimfire on 3 targets in each category at a distance of 50 feet.

Eye & ear protection is required for all shooters. Weekly practice will be on Saturdays from 9 to 1 p.m. Shooter fees are \$20.00 for Club members and \$30.00 for non-members. There is also a \$2.00 fee for targets at the practice sessions.

A couple of improvements we have made: installed *orange safety line* at the <u>300-yard range and the intermediate Cowboy</u> range. **Do not shoot this orange line or anything above it.** Keep all bullets well below into the range area.

We have built boxes to go around the trash cans to help keep them from blowing over. **Thank you to everyone for picking up trash when the cans blew over!** Please try to keep the lids on the cans. Have fun and be safe!

REMINDERS:

- ✓ **MEMBERS MUST BE PRESENT IF THEIR KEY IS USED AT THE OUTDOOR RANGE**. Please be prepared to show your 4CRP Membership Card whenever asked!
- ✓ Keep the gate closed and lock it when you leave!
- ✓ There are extra trash bags in the Target Shed; if the trash is full, please take it to the dumpster. Little things like this will help to keep the Outdoor Range tidy and clean so all of us can enjoy it.
- ✓ Shooters in the field need to be aware of their target and what is behind that target, i.e., can the bullet potentially ricochet into one of the other ranges or over the berm? You are responsible for the bullet once it leaves the muzzle of your gun until it stops. This includes ricochets!
- ✓ Please be aware of cylinder and muzzle blasts on the sandbags which can cause holes to be burnt in the denim covering.

Outdoor Range Notes continued

RIMFIRE BENCHREST

Because of light turnouts for Rimfire Benchrest events this year, no championship points were awarded. The events were turned into fun shoots and test sessions. We expect to start the new season in May 2021.

Next season we will introduce a "Sporter" Class for people interested in improving their target shooting, but do not want to invest in a lot of specialized benchrest equipment. The matches will be similar to the Pink-Off Benchrest, but at longer ranges, 50-100 yards. If there is interest, the ranges may be extended to extreme long range. The rules are still under discussion, but the intention is to allow most of the rifles people are currently shooting in the Plink-Off (not specifically built for target shooting) with only simple bipod or bags as rests. Some of the sporting characteristics required will be repeater actions and lighter weight than the BR rifles, so bring your CZ's and 10/22's.

FOUR CORNERS RIFLE AND PISTOL CLUB (4CRP) OUTDOOR RANGE USE AND SAFETY RULES

As a member of 4CRP Club (herein referred to as "Club"), you agree, upon penalty of loss of membership, to abide by established practices of Range use and safe gun handling. Your membership in the Club depends upon your ability to follow the safety rules described here. <u>ALL SHOOTERS UNDER THE AGE OF 18 YEARS MUST HAVE DIRECT ADULT</u> SUPERVISION.

Everyone at Club Ranges is equally responsible for safety. If you see an unsafe or potentially unsafe situation occurring, holler, "STOP!" After the issue is resolved, give the "All clear--the line is hot" command.


We have various shooting 'Ranges' at the Outdoor Range that are available for use by members and accompanied guests:

- 1. **22 Rimfire**: This Range is designed for safe use **only** with standard 22-rimfire ammunition, specifically: *Short, Long, and Long Rifle*. The use of any rimfire **magnum** ammunition or centerfire ammunition, of any kind, is **prohibited** on the 22 Rimfire Range.
- 2. <u>Rifle Benchrest (with gong targets at 500 yards)</u>: This Range has hanging gong targets of various sizes. These are thick enough to allow use with anything of less power and penetration potential than 50 BMG armor piercing. **Do not** deliberately shoot at the surrounding wooden structure.
- 3. <u>Rifle Benchrest</u> (with target berms at 100, 200, and 300 yards—the hillside at the far end is past 300 yards): This Range has steel gong targets at various distances. The 100-yard berm has been designed to allow firing at targets at any distance up to 100 yards so long as the target backer places the target at a height that assures subsequent impact into the berm. This Range also has various steel gong targets; do not shoot at these with any gun having more power and velocity than a conventional 30-caliber belted magnum (300 Win Mag, etc.).
- 4. **Pistol** (with a berm at about 20 yards): To prevent bullets ricocheting out of the confinement zone, this Range requires use of our target backers, or reaction targets placed at a similar height.
- 5. The 3 Gun Shoot Range and the two Range areas used by the Cowboy Shooters are not available for unsupervised Club member use. These areas are identified by signage.

Note: The Pistol and Rifle Benchrest Ranges have storage rooms at the left end of the shooting lines. These hold target backers, stools, and various supplies along with brooms and trash bags.

OUTDOOR RANGE RULES INCLUDE, BUT ARE NOT LIMITED TO, THE FOLLOWING:

- > TREAT ALL GUNS AS IF THEY ARE LOADED AT ALL TIMES
- NEVER POINT ANY GUN AT ANYTHING YOU DO NOT INTEND TO DESTROY OR PAY FOR
- KEEP YOUR FINGER OFF THE TRIGGER UNTIL YOU ARE READY TO SHOOT
- > BE AWARE OF YOUR TARGET, ITS BACKSTOP AND BEYOND
- Always wear eye and ear protection when on or near the shooting line.
- Use of the Outdoor Range is limited to daylight hours. On occasion, various Club activities require closure of one or more of the shooting ranges. We announce these closures ahead of time in the Club Newsletter, through emails, and on the Club Website.
- Guests at the Range must be accompanied by the Member and more than five guests at one time should be coordinated with the Range Officer.
- At all times while on any of the Club Ranges, unless the gun is in your hand(s) and it is aiming toward the target, it must be: unloaded, with the action open, and with the barrel pointed in a safe direction.
- > Rifles resting in the provided gun racks must have the action open and the magazine removed, or have an empty-chamber indicator flag inserted into the chamber.
- Never fire any gun that may not be safe to operate. Never use ammunition not designed for use in the gun you are firing. Never place your finger on the trigger until you are ready to shoot.
- Never fire any gun when you do not have it aimed at a specific target that is within the zone of **acceptable** target placement as noted at this Range.
- Never insert a cleaning rod or ramrod into the bore of any gun on the shooting bench; open the action, remove the magazine, and move the gun to a cleaning table.

Acceptable target placement includes:

- Clay pigeons near the middle elevation of the berms and toward the bottom of the 300-yard hillside,
- Paper targets on the target backers,
- * Reaction targets designed to safely deflect bullets downward or to dissipate most of the energy (when used according to the manufacturer's criteria, but only when elevated so that misses hit the berm). If in doubt, do not use it!

Unacceptable target placement includes:

- Anywhere on or near the ground between the shooting line and the bottom of the target berm;
- > On or near the top of any berm; more than halfway up the hillside behind the 300-yard shooting line;
- > Or so that shooting could result in a bullet escaping sideways from the Range.

NOTE: Members and their guests will make all reasonable efforts not to destroy the target backers. Avoid shooting into the support structure or the wood frames.

PROHIBITED AT THE OUTDOOR RANGE

- Fully automatic guns.
- Armor piercing or tracer ammunition. If in doubt, do not shoot it.
- The use of any military ammunition with any color paint on the bullet tip.
- Use of Club target backers for shotgun use—bring and use your own target backers for shotgun use.

CLEAN UP

Pick up and dispose your trash and empty shotgun hulls in the trash cans provided at various locations at each Range or the trash dumpster. Spent brass casings should be swept from the cement pads.

MEMBER PLEDGE

We expect our members and their guests to strive toward absolute safety at all times, and at all costs. This means following the rules described herein and all other rules of safe gun handling and use. When it comes to gun-handling, bad habits can and do lead to tragedy. Your failure to abide by these rules may constitute just cause to revoke your membership. Members are equally responsible for the safety and Range-rule related actions of their guests. Any revoked membership will result in forfeiture of your entire annual membership fee, Range key and loss of use of the Club Ranges, *including shooting at the Range as another member's quest*.

The NRA Pledge: I certify that I am a citizen of the United States of America and that I am not a member of any organization or group which has in any part of its programs-the attempt to overthrow the Government of the USA or any of its political subdivisions by force or violence; that I have never been convicted of a crime of violence, and if admitted to membership, I will faithfully endeavor to fulfil the obligations of good sportsmanship and good citizenship.

Four Corners Rifle & Pistol Club Pledge: I further declare that I support the Constitution of the USA and swear not to support any movement that would close shooting facilities, deny access to public lands, restrict hunting sports, or in any way limit the rights of honest citizens to own firearms in a legal manner.

NRA Membership Required: For insurance purposes you **MUST** be a <u>MEMBER of the NRA</u> to be a member of Four Corners Rifle and Pistol Club. Your NRA Membership number is required on the next page of this Application.

Types Of 4CRP Memberships (Bylaws Article III)

Any citizen of the US eighteen years of age or over shall be eligible for membership in the Club after subscribing to the following pledges and on payment of the required dues. Anyone becoming a member of the Club shall furnish proof of membership in the National Rifle Association of America, hereinafter referred to as the NRA, or become an NRA member simultaneous with becoming a member of the Club...

- 1. **Regular member:** Any person who meets the above requirements and is 18 years of age or over. An active Regular member shall be entitled to hold office, vote, and enjoy all privileges and benefits offered by the Club including daytime access to Outdoor Range.
- 2. **Associate member:** The spouse of a Regular member and meets the above requirements. May use Outdoor Range key without Regular member being present.
- 3. **Junior member:** A person under the age of 18 who is a child of a Regular member or is a member of the Junior Shooting Program of the Club, and who meets the above requirements. All junior members and shooters under eighteen years of age will shoot/fire under the supervision of a qualified adult.


