  - Active \*NRA Membership is required for all levels of membership in 4CRP; NRA membership number and expiration date
    are required on the 4CRP application.
  - Every applicant is required to complete the revised membership application, read and agree that you will comply with the **Outdoor Range Use and Safety Rules** by signing the application certification.
  - All applications for membership must contain **REQUIRED** and/or **MANDATORY** information to be processed. This includes:
    - Current mailing address (so your membership card can be mailed to you and/or you wish to receive newsletters via U.S. mail)
    - Telephone number (a must to verify your application info if needed, e.g. you are who you say you are, etc., or contact you in an emergency situation).
    - Email address: 4CRP primarily communicates with its members regularly via emails to let members know about Club activities, events, range closures, request for volunteers, send newsletters, etc. Email addresses are kept CONFIDENTIAL (unless a member has given the Club authorization to publish it)

# ATTENTION!!!! 2021 BOARD ELECTION BALLOT

The Official 4CRP <u>Ballot</u> for the 2021 Executive Board Election is included in this issue on a separate page by itself. Deadline to submit your vote is **February 23, 2021** at the regular monthly meeting.

You may bring your Ballot to the February 23<sup>rd</sup> meeting. If you choose to mail your ballot, please *carefully* follow the instructions on back side of the Ballot so it meets all of the 4CRP Bylaw voting rules and can be counted.

## **Article X – Nomination and Election Procedures**

#### 1. Nomination of Candidates:

- a. The Club President will appoint a Nominating Committee in preparation for the coming election. The Nominating Committee will be comprised of three members, Chaired by a member of the existing Executive Committee, and including at least one Club member who is not currently on the Executive Committee.
- b. The purpose of the Nominating Committee is to prepare a list of eligible Active Regular members as nominees for the offices of President, Vice President, Secretary, Treasurer, Indoor Range Officer, Outdoor Range Officer, Junior Shooting Program Director, and three (3) Club Directors. These ten officers and directors comprise the Executive Committee of the Club.
- C. The December issue of the Crack Shot will include a Nominations form for the purpose of petitioning members to submit names of potential candidates for office. To be considered, the Nominations form must be returned to the Club Secretary prior to the January Regular Club Meeting.
- d. The Nominating Committee will review the submitted names and contact other members to solicit names of members interested in becoming a Candidate for office. The names of all members who have expressed interest in proceeding to an election will be presented at the Regular Club Meeting in January. At the January meeting, any additional names submitted will be included in the listing.
- e. Immediately following the January Regular meeting, a Mail-In Ballot will be prepared and will be included in the February issue of the *Crack Shot*. This Ballot will list each position of Club Office, and the name of members who are candidates for each office.

#### . Rules for the Mail-In Ballot:

- a. If a Regular member wishes to vote by mail instead of in person at the Annual Meeting, the Mail-In Ballot must be returned to the Club Secretary prior to that meeting. A MEMBER CAN ONLY VOTE ONCE: EITHER BY MAIL-IN BALLOT OR IN PERSON AT THE ANNUAL MEETING.
- b. The following procedure must be followed for the Active Regular member's Mail-In Ballot to be verified and counted:
  - i. Using black or blue ink, the member must clearly mark each vote on the Mail-In Ballot that was included in the *Crack Shot*, or a facsimile thereof. The Ballot must not be signed; a signed Ballot will be invalidated.
  - ii. Insert only the Ballot in an envelope (not provided) and mail that envelope to the Club Secretary.
  - iii. Include a return address on the envelope clearly stating the member's name and mailing address. This information will be used to verify the member's vote. It is vital that the return address and name be clearly legible. Print the word "BALLOT" on the lower left hand front corner of the mailing envelope.
  - iv. Seal the envelope and sign across the sealed edge on the back of the mailing envelope. A member's signature on the envelope flap is required to validate the ballot contained in the envelope.
- c. The envelopes will be received by the Club Secretary, will <u>not</u> be opened by the Secretary, and will be delivered <u>unopened</u> to the Election Judge at the Annual Meeting.

### 3. Election Night Voting Procedure:

- a. First, there shall be a Quorum Call, with an attendance sheet signed by all attendees and mail-in voting members also duly recorded. Provided that a quorum is present, the Voting Procedure will continue.
- b. The President shall appoint a three person Election Committee responsible to conduct the proceedings of the Election of Officers during the Annual meeting. The Committee shall be Chaired by a member of the Nominating Committee and include an Election Judge and a Poll Watcher who are Regular members. The duties of the three Committee members shall be:
  - i. The Chair shall act as moderator for the business of the Election, and shall record each vote count and tally in a manner visible to all members in attendance, and shall formally announce the results of each vote.
  - ii. The Judge shall receive the ballots, including those mailed in or handed in at the meeting.
  - iii. The Poll Watcher shall assist in the handling of the ballots, and oversee their disposition to further assure a fair election.
- c. Before opening any ballots or beginning the voting process, members who did submit a Mail-In ballot and who are in attendance at the meeting will be given the option of withdrawing their Mail-In ballot and thereby vote in person.
- d. With the help of the Club Secretary, using the current Club membership list, the Judge will verify that the return address of each mailed in ballot is legitimately that of a Club member.
- e. At the appropriate time, the Judge will open the ballots, whether mailed in or handed in at the meeting, and announce each vote, which will be duly recorded in a visible manner to those present
- f. There will be pre-printed ballots available election night. Each Candidate previously identified and vetted by the Nomination Committee will be shown on the pre-printed ballot.
- q. Voting by proxy will not be allowed.
- h. Members in attendance can submit additional nominations, including late mail-ins. Provided that the nominee does attest a willingness to serve if elected, the nominees name will be visibly recorded and may be added to the ballot as a write-in candidate as any member may desire.
- i. Before voting commences, each candidate will have the opportunity to make a brief "campaign speech", extolling their qualifications and willingness to serve.
- j. Voting will be by secret ballot, unless there is only one candidate for a specific office in which case a voice vote of acclimation will be called, provided there is no objection from the electorate.
- k. The order of voting will begin with the office of President, then Vice President, Secretary, Treasurer, Indoor Range Officer, Outdoor Range Officer, Junior Shooting Program Director, and finally three (3) Club Directors.

#### Article X – Nomination and Election Procedures continued

- i. For each position, except Club Directors, the vote will be one vote for one candidate until a winner is decided by majority vote.
- ii. If there is no winner by majority vote on the first ballot, the top two candidates will be immediately entered into a runoff election. Mail-in ballots will be counted in the runoff as in the initial vote.
- iii. If the runoff vote ends in a tie, the winner will be decided by coin toss, either "heads-or-tails" or "odd man out." The coin will be handled by the Election Judge.
- 1. For election of the three (3) Club Directors, members may vote for three candidates on the ballot. The top three vote getters will be named as winners provided that each has a majority vote. Otherwise, a runoff election with tie-breaking coin toss will be used until each of the elected has a majority vote.
- m. If there is no candidate put forward for an office, then as herein defined the incumbent office holder shall continue to hold office until a successor is elected or appointed by the Executive Committee

## Thoughts from Mike Upchurch, 4CRP Vice President

#### WHAT WYATT EARP SAID ABOUT PISTOL ACCURACY

Asked numerous times about his amazing ability to win gunfights, Wyatt Earp was often quoted as saying, "Fast is fine, but accuracy is everything. You must learn to be slow in a hurry." Some suggest his actual word was "final" instead of "everything." Earp mastered the art of moving quickly, but with clear focus and direction. Our police, military, and security officials are always improving their aim when shooting a pistol. Those who chose to carry concealed and participate in handgun competitions wish for a well-placed aim no matter what application you use it for. Here are tips on improving your pistol aiming. Without consulting Wyatt Earp (LOL) and being that ammo is expensive these days, practicing dry firing can save costs, while affording you the opportunity to improve your skills. Without recoil, you can determine how to perform good posture and good trigger sueeze.

- \* Avoid *pulling* the trigger; there is a fine line between squeezing and pulling.
- \* Avoid improper placement of the trigger finger.
- \* Avoid tightening grip and fingers at trigger pull.
- \* Avoid anticipating the recoil that causes a push.
- \* Avoid jerking due to anticipating recoil.
- \* Avoid drooping of the head.
- \* Stop breaking wrist up, by watching yourself in a mirror.
- \* Practice dry firing makes perfect 'cents' and saves money.

## **Spring Pistol League**

There is still time to get into the Spring Pistol League at the Indoor Range which started January 20th. Remaining dates are: Wednesdays, 3-7 p.m.,
January 27; February 3<sup>rd</sup>, 10<sup>th</sup>, 17<sup>th</sup>, 24<sup>th</sup>; March 3<sup>rd</sup> and 10th. The basic league format is essentially the same as last year. Shooters are divided into

Red Dot and Iron Sight categories, and we also will have an Off-The-Chart category for new shooters, your choice. Each night everyone will shoot 30 rounds of centerfire and 30 rounds of .22 rimfire on 3 targets in each category at a distance of 50 feet.

Eye & ear protection is required for all shooters. Weekly practice will be on Saturdays from 9 to 1 p.m.

- Shooter fees are \$20.00 for Club members and \$30.00 for non-members. There is also a \$2.00 fee for targets at the practice sessions.

The outdoor range is pretty quiet this time of the year. I would like to thank Jeff Stewart and the Windy Gap "Cowboys" for the dirt work they have done at the Cowboy Range (west of the 3 Gun Range). A couple of improvements we have made: installed *orange safety line* at the 300-yard range and the intermediate Cowboy range. Do not shoot this orange line or anything above it. Keep all bullets well below into the range area.

#### **REMINDERS:**

- ✓ **MEMBERS MUST BE PRESENT IF THEIR KEY IS USED AT THE OUTDOOR RANGE**. Please be prepared to show your 4CRP Membership Card whenever asked!
- ✓ Keep the gate closed and lock it when you leave
- ✓ There are extra trash bags in the Target Shed; if the trash is full, please take it to the dumpster. Little things like this will help to keep the Outdoor Range tidy and clean so all of us can enjoy it.
- ✓ Shooters in the field need to be aware of their target and what is behind that target, i.e., can the bullet potentially ricochet into one of the other ranges or over the berm? You are responsible for the bullet once it leaves the muzzle of your gun until it stops. This includes ricochets!
- ✓ Please be aware of cylinder and muzzle blasts on the sandbags which can cause holes to be burnt in the denim covering.

## FOUR CORNERS RIFLE AND PISTOL CLUB (4CRP) OUTDOOR RANGE USE AND SAFETY RULES

As a member of 4CRP Club (herein referred to as "Club"), you agree, upon penalty of loss of membership, to abide by established practices of Range use and safe gun handling. Your membership in the Club depends upon your ability to follow the safety rules described here. <u>ALL SHOOTERS UNDER THE AGE OF 18 YEARS MUST HAVE DIRECT ADULT SUPERVISION</u>.

Everyone at Club Ranges is equally responsible for safety. If you see an unsafe or potentially unsafe situation occurring, holler, "STOP!" After the issue is resolved, give the "All clear--the line is hot" command.


We have various shooting 'Ranges' at the Outdoor Range that are available for use by members and accompanied guests:

- 22 Rimfire: This Range is designed for safe use <u>only</u> with standard 22-rimfire ammunition, specifically: Short, Long, and Long Rifle. The use of any rimfire <u>magnum</u> ammunition or centerfire ammunition, of any kind, is prohibited on the 22 Rimfire Range.
- Rifle Benchrest (with gong targets at 500 yards): This Range has hanging gong targets of various sizes. These
  are thick enough to allow use with anything of less power and penetration potential than 50 BMG armor piercing.
  Do not deliberately shoot at the surrounding wooden structure.
- 3. <u>Riffe Benchrest</u> (with target berms at 100, 200, and 300 yards—the hillside at the far end is past 300 yards): This Range has steel gong targets at various distances. The 100-yard berm has been designed to allow firing at targets at any distance up to 100 yards so long as the target backer places the target at a height that assures subsequent impact into the berm. This Range also has various steel gong targets; do not shoot at these with any gun having more power and velocity than a conventional 30-caliber belted magnum (300 Win Mag, etc.).
- Pistol (with a berm at about 20 yards): To prevent bullets ricocheting out of the confinement zone, this Range requires use of our target backers, or reaction targets placed at a similar height.
- The 3 Gun Shoot Range and the two Range areas used by the Cowboy Shooters are not available for unsupervised Club member use. These areas are identified by signage.

Note: The Pistol and Rifle Benchrest Ranges have storage rooms at the left end of the shooting lines. These hold target backers, stools, and various supplies along with brooms and trash bags.

#### OUTDOOR RANGE RULES INCLUDE, BUT ARE NOT LIMITED TO, THE FOLLOWING:

- TREAT ALL GUNS AS IF THEY ARE LOADED AT ALL TIMES
- NEVER POINT ANY GUN AT ANYTHING YOU DO NOT INTEND TO DESTROY OR PAY FOR
- > KEEP YOUR FINGER OFF THE TRIGGER UNTIL YOU ARE READY TO SHOOT
- BE AWARE OF YOUR TARGET, ITS BACKSTOP AND BEYOND
- Always wear eye and ear protection when on or near the shooting line.
- Use of the Outdoor Range is limited to daylight hours. On occasion, various Club activities require closure of one or more of the shooting ranges. We announce these closures ahead of time in the Club Newsletter, through emails, and on the Club Website.
- Guests at the Range must be accompanied by the Member and more than five guests at one time should be coordinated with the Range Officer.
- At all times while on any of the Club Ranges, unless the gun is in your hand(s) and it is aiming toward the target, it must be: unloaded, with the action open, and with the barrel pointed in a safe direction.
- Rifles resting in the provided gun racks must have the action open and the magazine removed, or have an empty-chamber indicator flag inserted into the chamber.
- Never fire any gun that may not be safe to operate. Never use ammunition not designed for use in the gun you are firing. Never place your finger on the trigger until you are ready to shoot.
- Never fire any gun when you do not have it aimed at a specific target that is within the zone of acceptable target placement as noted at this Range.
- Never insert a cleaning rod or ramrod into the bore of any gun on the shooting bench; open the action, remove the magazine, and move the gun to a cleaning table.

#### Acceptable target placement includes:

- Clay pigeons near the middle elevation of the berms and toward the bottom of the 300-yard hillside,
- Paper targets on the target backers,
- Reaction targets designed to safely deflect bullets downward or to dissipate most of the energy (when used
  according to the manufacturer's criteria, but only when elevated so that misses hit the berm). If in doubt, do not
  use it!

#### Unacceptable target placement includes:

- Anywhere on or near the ground between the shooting line and the bottom of the target berm;
- On or near the top of any berm; more than halfway up the hillside behind the 300-yard shooting line;
- Or so that shooting could result in a bullet escaping sideways from the Range.

NOTE: Members and their guests will make all reasonable efforts not to destroy the target backers. Avoid shooting into the support structure or the wood frames.

## PROHIBITED AT THE OUTDOOR RANGE

- Fully automatic guns.
- Armor piercing or tracer ammunition. If in doubt, do not shoot it.
- The use of any military ammunition with any color paint on the bullet tip.
- Use of Club target backers for shotgun use—bring and use your own target backers for shotgun use.

#### CLEAN UP

Pick up and dispose your trash and empty shotgun hulls in the trash cans provided at various locations at each Range or the trash dumpster. Spent brass casings should be swept from the cement pads.

#### MEMBER PLEDGE

We expect our members and their guests to strive toward absolute safety at all times, and at all costs. This means following the rules described herein and all other rules of safe gun handling and use. When it comes to gun-handling, bad habits can and do lead to tragedy. Your failure to abide by these rules may constitute just cause to revoke your membership. Members are equally responsible for the safety and Range-rule related actions of their guests. Any revoked membership will result in forfeiture of your entire annual membership fee, Range key and loss of use of the Club Ranges, including shooting at the Range as another member's guest.

## Types Of 4CRP Memberships (Bylaws Article III)

Any citizen of the US eighteen years of age or over shall be eligible for membership in the Club after subscribing to the following pledges and on payment of the required dues. Anyone becoming a member of the Club shall furnish proof of membership in the National Rifle Association of America, hereinafter referred to as the NRA, or become an NRA member simultaneous with becoming a member of the Club...

- 1. **Regular member:** Any person who meets the above requirements and is 18 years of age or over. An active Regular member shall be entitled to hold office, vote, and enjoy all privileges and benefits offered by the Club including daytime access to Outdoor Range.
- 2. **Associate member:** The spouse of a Regular member and meets the above requirements. May use Outdoor Range key without Regular member being present.
- 3. **Junior member:** A person under the age of 18 who is a child of a Regular member or is a member of the Junior Shooting Program of the Club, and who meets the above requirements. All junior members and shooters under eighteen years of age will shoot/fire under the supervision of a qualified adult.
