 - Active *NRA Membership is required for all levels of membership in 4CRP; NRA membership number and expiration date are
 required on the 4CRP application.
 - Every applicant is required to complete the revised membership application, read and agree that you will comply with the Outdoor Range Use and Safety Rules by signing the application certification.
 - All applications for membership must contain REQUIRED and/or MANDATORY information to be processed. This includes:
 - Current mailing address (so your membership card can be mailed to you and/or you wish to receive newsletters via US mail)
 - ♦ Telephone number (a must to verify your application info if needed, or contact you in an emergency situation)
 - ♦ **Email address**: 4CRP primarily communicates with its members regularly via emails to let members know about Club activities, events, range closures, request for volunteers, send newsletters, etc. Email addresses are kept <u>CONFIDENTIAL</u> (unless a member has given the Club authorization to publish it)

The indoor range is pretty quiet this time of year. I would like to thank Jeff Stewert and the Windy Gap "Cowboys" for the dirt work they have done at the Cowboy Range (west of the 3 Gun Range). A couple of improvements we have made: installed orange safety line at the <u>300-yard range and</u> the intermediate Cowboy range. **Do not shoot this orange line or anything above it.** Keep all bullets well below the range area.

Reminders:

- Members must be present if their key is used at the outdoor range. Please, be prepared to show your 4CRP
 Membership card whenever asked!
- Keep the gate closed and lock it when you leave
- There are extra trash bags in the Target Shed; if the trash is full, please take it to the dumpster. Little things like this will help keep the Outdoor Range tidy and clean so all of us can enjoy it.
- Shooters in the field need to be aware of their target and what is behind that target, i.e., can the bullet potentially
 ricochet into one of the other ranges or over the berm? You are responsible for the bullet once it leaves the muzzle
 of your gun until it stops. This includes ricochets!
- Please, be aware of the cylinder and muzzle blasts on the sandbags which can cause holes to be burnt in the denim covering.

4 Corners WOMEN at the RANGE - June Instructional Shooting Clinic Saturday, JUNE 5th

This will be the NINTH year 4CRP has offered a women's instructional shooting clinic -- with frequent grants from the NRA Foundation totaling approximately \$12,000.00 over the years.

This day-long clinic is specifically aimed at women who have had little or no shooting experience—though often women attend because they have not been able to shoot frequently. 4CRP provides everything for this day: *firearms, ammunition, targets, one-on-one assistance by Range Safety Officers, and even lunch—all for \$35*! This clinic generally fills at least 2 months in advance.

There is a limit of 24 shooters and it is already half way filled, so contact Anita Mayhew ASAP to get signed up.


